The Lieutenant Governor in Council.

The undersigned has the honour to report that, having received satisfactory proof that the area mentioned hereunder is not included within any incorporated City, Town or rural Municipality and that the area contains not less than fifteen dwelling houses, he has, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of The Village Ordinance, caused notices to be posted in three conspicuous places within the area, one of which was the Post Office, announcing the intention to establish the area as a Village after the expiration of thirty days from the date of posting such notices:

He further reports that the said notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof :

The undersigned therefore begs to recommend that, under the provisions of Section 4 of The Village Ordinance, Section 15 in Township 16 Range 28 West of the Fourth Meridian be established as a Village; that the Village be given the name of N A N T O N ; that W.L.Watt, of Nanton, be appointed Returning Officer to act at the election of an Overseer for the said Village; and that the said election for an Overseer for the Village in question be held on Monday the sixth day of July, 1903.
